League Rules & Frequently Asked Questions
(REVISED 3/1/09)



Intent:

To provide a developmental league to further the skill of team and individual play.

To create a venue for younger referees to better their skills in preparation for more competitive games.

Participants:

U8-U10 boys and girls teams.

Your team MUST have been registered during the Winter Season to be eligible to participate.

**Clarification: Your team has to be registered in the Winter Season. Players are eligible if they have joined this team after the winter season.*

HSL is sanctioned by HYSA, therefore all players & coaches must be HYSA registered.

Because of availability of fields at Waipio Soccer Complex; HSL will limit the team enrollment to 32 teams. **Teams will be wait-listed after the maximum team threshold is met.**

Dates and Times:

Games are played on Sundays, beginning on April 5 and ending May 17.

No rain-out days will be scheduled.

Game times are: 9:00, 10:00, 11:00, 12:00, 1:00, 2:00, 3:00, 4:00

Team Match Up:

Match up between opponents: We will attempt to have evenly matched games as possible, based on your performance from last season.

Teams will be placed in designated pools to obtain the best match-up as possible. Coaches will be asked to select the “competition” level of their team at registration.

Referees:

Oahu League Referee Assignor will provide the center referee.

In the case where a center referee is absent from a game, the HSL Coordinator will assign a club referee to the game and reimburse that team the center referee fee. Please notify the HSL Coordinator when this occurs ASAP.

Game Format:

U8-U10 Teams

8-a-side. Seven field players, one goalkeeper. (minimum 5 players at start of game)

Referee will check players and coaches pass before start of game.

The coach provides the roster – Use your Winter League Roster.

U8 ball size - #3, U10 ball size - #4.

Game Length:

U8 Teams – 20 minute halves with a 5-minute break at half.

U9-10 Teams – 25 minute halves with a 5-minute break at half.

Game Results:

No scores will be recorded. No Protests will be allowed.

Rules of Conduct:

The Hawaii Spring League is sanctioned by HYSA. Players and coaches must be registered, show respect and sportsmanship at all times. Misconduct will be brought to the attention of the HSL Coordinator and brought before the Oahu League disciplinary committee.

Spectator behavior is the responsibility of the team's head coach. Should misconduct occur from the spectators, the head coach may be sanctioned by the HSL.

If a team cannot make a scheduled game:

As a courtesy to your opponent and the referee, you must show up for your scheduled game. If for any reason your team cannot make a game; notify the HSL Coordinator know at least one week in advance. This way we can find a replacement for your team. The HSL will impose a \$50 fee if your team does not show without notifying the HSL Coordinator.
